My ambition at the time was to be a physicist and fly the first rocket to the moon (my classmates thought this laughable).

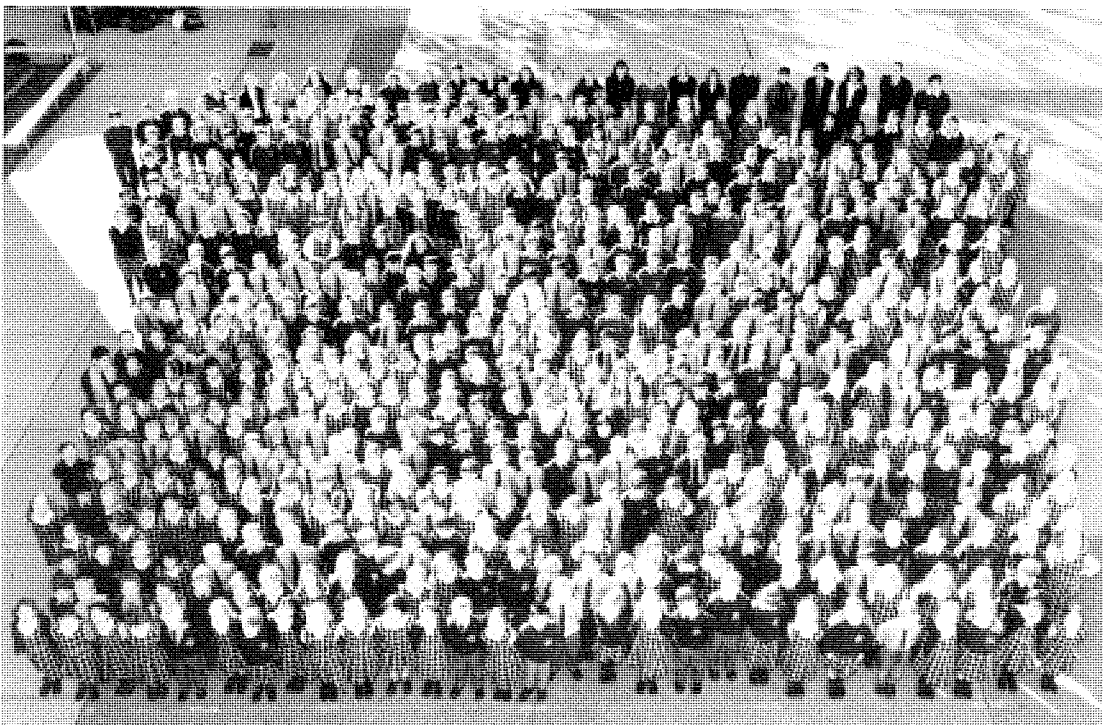
